- Heavily invest in mentorship.
- Assigned two people to aid you when hired.
- Given a career advisor as well who helps you set and achieve goals
- Busy season can be around 55 hours a week.
- In tax, a set of clients are assigned to you on a day to day basis.
- Weekly meetings to discuss updates and announcements.

Day in the life of audit

- RSM uses caseware for auditing.
- First year associates usually audit cash accounts
- New hires mainly work on low risk accounts.

- Having good writing skills is necessary when performing audits.
- There is a lot of interaction with your team and clients.
- New hires are given a variety of different industries to work with.

#### Questions:

- 1. How much time do you spend on client sites. During busy season, a majority of the time is spent on the client site. Because of covid, it is usually around 2-3 days a week.
- 2. What is the farthest you go for clients? **RSM mainly hangs around the San Diego** Area, the farthest in the area is Oceanside. If you want to travel, you may be selected to help other offices around the country.
- 3. How does RSM work around the CPA exam? It is recommended to try and pass a few parts before working. It is very hard to balance work and studying. RSM gives you time off to study and take your exams.
- 4. What order do you recommend studying for the CPA. FAR and REG have the most info, BEC is the easiest. AUD was good to save for last because you learn a lot of audit information while working in Audit. It is recommended to do the hardest tests first.
